Directions

- If only conclusion I follows.
- If only conclusion II follows.
- If either conclusion I or II follows.
- If neither conclusion I nor II follows.
- If both conclusions I and II follow

Some pen are clips.
Some clips are pin.

Conclusions:

- Some pins are pens
- No pin is a pen

1. Statement:

Some boys are students.
All students are tall.

Conclusion:

- Some boy are tall.
- All boy are tall

2. Statement:

Some books are pen.
Some pens are pencil.

Conclusion

- Some pen are book.
- Some pencil are pen.

3. Statement:

Some water are tea.
No tea are coffee.

Conclusions:

- Some water are tea.
- No water is coffee.

4. Statement:

Some dog are cow.
No cow is cat.

Conclusions:

- No dog is cat
- No cat is dog

5. Statement:

In each of the questions below are given some statements followed by two conclusions. You have to take the given statement to be true even if they said to be variance with commonly known facts. Read all conclusions and then decide which of the given conclusion logically follows from the given statements disregarding commonly known facts.

- If only conclusion I follows.
- If only conclusion II follows.
- If either conclusion I or II follows.
- If neither conclusion I nor II follows
- If both conclusions I and II follow

6. Statements:

All alloys are Balls.
No Balls are cats.
Some Cats are Dogs.

Conclusion:

- Some alloys are cats
- Some Balls are Dogs.

7. Statements:

Some cats are dogs.
All dogs are Tigers.
Some Tigers are Zebra

Conclusion:

- Some Cats Being Zebra is a Possibility.
- All Zebra being dogs is a Possibility.

8. Statements
All Mouse are books.
All books are laptops
Conclusion:

- I. All books are Mouse
- II. All Laptops are Mouse.

9. Statements
All Books are Bags
No bags are pens
Some pens are cats
No cats are books
Conclusion:

- I. Some bags are cats
- II. Some cats can be bags

10. Statements
All Jan are Feb.
No Feb is March
All March are April.
Some Feb are June
Conclusion:

- I. All June can be Jan.
- II. Some April are June.

11. Statements:
All the locks are keys.
All the keys are bats.
Some watches are bats.
Conclusion:

- 1. Some bats are locks.
- 2. Some watches are keys.
- 3. All the keys are locks.

Options:

- a) Only (1) and (2)
