Sixteen Rupaka coins were equal to one gold coin.


5. Who was the first Indian to win the World Amateur Billiards title?



The Oceans Seven marathon consists of seven long-distance open-water swims, which include the North Channel, the Cook Strait, the Molokai Channel, the English Channel, the Catalina Channel, the Tsugaru Strait, and the Strait of Gibraltar.

With this feat, Rohan has also become the 9th person in the world to swim across Ocean Seven.

❖ India's Tejaswin Shankar clinched victory in the men's High Jump event at the USATF Festival in Tucson, Arizona, USA.

❖ He cleared 2.23 metres in his first attempt to secure the top spot at the World Athletics Continental Tour – Silver event.

❖ Earnie Sears of USA finished second, while Roberto Vilches of Mexico was third.

❖ Another Indian athlete, Sarvesh Kushare cleared 2.13m to finish fifth.

106. Yuzvendra Chahal first India player to reach 350-wicket mark in T20 cricket

❖ Yuzvendra Chahal became the first Indian to reach 350 T20 wickets, achieving the milestone during IPL 2024 against Delhi Capitals.

- ❖ Chahal's historic wicket came from dismissing DC captain Rishabh Pant, marking his 350th victim in his 301st T20 match.
- ❖ He joined elite spinners like Rashid Khan, Sunil Narine, Imran Tahir Shakib Al Hasan in the 350 T20 wicket club, sitting fifth in the list.
- Company partnered:
 - Coca-Cola India's Anandana Foundation partnered with Hockey India for the National Women's Hockey League 2024, marking its first involvement in women's hockey at the national level.
 - Amul, the Indian milk producer, has been appointed as the 'Official Sponsor' of the Sri Lanka Men's Team for the ICC Men's T20 World Cup 2024.
